We are sharing an update from the state with news of a court order extending Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for individuals from Haiti, below. [Here](#) is a news report on the court order.

On February 2, 2026, the Federal District Court in Washington D.C. in the case of *Miot v. Trump*, 1:25-cv-02471, ordered that the Trump Administration's termination of TPS for Haiti set to take effect February 3, 2026, has been stayed. The court's order means TPS for individuals from Haiti, and associated work authorizations, will remain in place while further proceedings are ongoing. What does this mean for individuals from Haiti who have TPS?

If you have TPS for Haiti, that protection has been extended temporarily, pending further court proceedings. If you have work authorization based on your TPS status, that authorization is also extended. This is a temporary extension, so it is important to monitor the USCIS website below and trusted sources for updates as the litigation continues.

What does this mean for employers?

For employers, this means TPS recipients CAN continue to work, for now. This may change if the Trump administration successfully appeals the federal district court's decision to a higher court.

We expect the USCIS website to be updated shortly to provide further confirmation of the court's decision. Please check for updated information regularly. [USCIS: Temporary Protected Status Designated Country: Haiti](#)
